

## Personal Information protection against “phishing”

We all have sites that we frequently use on the Internet...

... and also some that you do business with and receive personal email from...

A bank invested in people.

... but how do you know if a link you are clicking on will take you to the correct site, and not an information scam or phishing scam?



## Here's how you will know!

Simply use your mouse to HOVER over the link (DO NOT click on the link) and the TRUE link site will appear at the bottom of your web browser! Do this with **ANY** link that may look suspicious or to **ANY** link that you may receive from a bank, store, etc. to insure that the link is safe and not malicious.

## Here's an Example:

Dear Chase Online<sup>SM</sup> Customer:

We recently reviewed all our accounts and suspect that your online banking account might have been accessed by an unauthorized third party.

Protecting the security of your account is our primary concern, therefore as a preventive measure, we have temporarily limited access to sensitive account features.

To restore your account access, we need you to confirm your identity.

Please follow the link below to proceed to confirming your account information:
